## Annual Report 2020-2021

\*This year 2020-2021 will go down in history as never to be forgotten. The pandemic took the world by storm. Every nook and corner was infected and coming home to our students, life came to a stand- still. Initially there was fear and trepidation but we at Carmel picked up the reigns with great faith and resilience and turned the year into a memorable one.

\*The entire staff got the cogwheels rolling with online classes for every section. With a quick training everyone got on board and classes ran smoothly with few glitches, enabling us to complete the set syllabus within the parameters of safety stated by the government of Kuwait.

\*The year commenced with 2683 students on roll and 128 teaching and non- teaching staff.

\*In April, students entered their new classes virtually and arrangements were made for book collection to enhance their learning.

\*A new School Management Software called Track My School (TMS) was launched and Zoom was integrated through this system to facilitate virtual classes. Assignments, notes and tests were conducted through this software.

\*A holistic approach to education was seen in the way the ART integrated project was conducted for the students. Hands on activities with interaction and team work were displayed through their work. Teachers came together to discuss the Annual Year Plan and Term Plan giving importance for learning outcomes.

\*We conducted the compartment exams at the Indian Embassy from 22, September 2020 to 30, September 2020.

\*An Online staff meeting was held in May wherein teachers shared their views and ideas and feedback of the online classes and means to improve them.

\*School closed for the summer break though students were still in lockdown. Teachers attended CBSE webinar courses related to their subjects and child psychology so as to update and equip themselves with the current techniques through Blended learning. The courses opened a plethora of ideas and alternate learning strategies that gave them the confidence to forge ahead in this unprecedented times.

\*Classes resumed on August 4<sup>th</sup> 2020.The school conducted online voting and elections to foster the need for democracy and fair play. The students displayed their leadership qualities and were solemnized in an investiture ceremony on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2020 .Under the flag ship of head boy Acel Varghese and head girl, Jenisha Jarvin the elected cabinet displayed determination and creativity. They conducted the Carmel Kaleidoscope, an array of 22 competitions throughout the classes providing a platform for many. It was a grand success as it unleashed many a latent talent. Kudos to the Cabinet who displayed prosilience, piloting through turbulent times.

**\* Results:** - Lockdown but not knocked out, Carmel added yet another feather to its venerable cap by securing resplendent victory in the Board Exams. Despite the unprecedented quandary, our students evinced phenomenal resilience that brought alluring glory to their alma mater. In the AISSCE 2020, Neha Alapatt scored first position in the Science stream with a whopping 97.8 % and Neha Elizabeth Thomas, Sona Biju and Rhea Nair came in second with 97.6%. In the AISSE 2020, we have Acel Varghese with 98.2% and Prithvi Karthik with 97.4%. It was a commendable performance by the students despite the pressure of the uncertain state of affairs.

\*On the cultural front students were given plenty of opportunities to showcase their talents. They participated in a dance competition organized by FAIPS and emerged winners with Arya Arun Davidson (X) and Mrudula Naresh Lanjewar taking 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Indian folk dance and Japmeet Kaur Sethi and Avrel Leandra Pinto and Aurel Preann Pinto taking 3<sup>rd</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> place in Western dance.

Multifaceted that they are, the students also participated in many online competitions and brought home accolades. The Lebanon Art Competition, The Student Global Ambassador programme, CBSE Art Competition, Trianga-IIK and CBSE-Independence Day Competition to name a few.

\*The online classes were interspersed with Art, Health Education, P.T. and Value Education as that is the need of the hour in these lockdown days.

\*The school conducted an orientation after the vacations in keeping with the guidelines of social distancing by the MOE. The principal boosted the teachers and guided them to invest in their students.

**<u>\*Teachers' day</u>**: Growing up with value based education, the Carmel students celebrated their teachers on the 5<sup>th</sup> of September2020 on a virtual platform titled 'A Virtual Voyage'....lost without you.
